### From the Desk of Pastor Nick...

What is **holy** in your life? What do you have in close vicinity right now that you consider holy? What matters to you more than anything else?

Sometimes, it is important to ask ourselves these questions. I traveled to Iona this summer on a pilgrimage to see one of the oldest centers of Christian faith on the Isle of Britain. For many years, I had wanted to visit Iona because it is the birthplace of Celtic Christianity in Britain. While I was visiting the abbey there on the tiny island, I saw an ancient relic on display — the actual bones of St. Columba's right hand. St. Columba had painted the first illuminated text of the Bible on British soil with that very hand. This manuscript of the Gospel is so important to the Celtic missionaries that they have spent 1,400 years protecting and caring for the hand that wrote and drew it. Over the years, thousands of Christians have traveled hundreds of miles to come to this remote island, all in the hopes that they might cast their gaze upon this hand of St. Columba. This single relic is part of the reason the monastery on Iona has become so important. People want to be close to it, and not because they feel if they are in close proximity to it, they will be blessed, but rather because of the blessing they receive from reading the Biblical manuscript that this hand wrote. St. Columba's hand is a vehicle for God's grace to reach them. This relic is a visible reminder that God has acted in their lives.

Now, I'd like for you to spend a few minutes as you are reading this and think to yourself --- what do you have near you daily that is a visible reminder of God's grace at work in your lives?

Directly behind my head as I sit here at my desk writing this article is a collection of trinkets that I have collected from all over the world. From Samaria, I have a small jar of water from Jacob's well. From Ireland, I have a small, green, Connemara marble cross. From Corinth, I have a tiny owl made from Corinthian bronze. But the most important things I look at every day are the pictures I took while standing under the dome in the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem, where Christ was crucified. Almost every day, I look at these mementos, and I remember God's grace. These things are holy to me. They remind me of God's actions in my life.

Again, what mementos do you have that help you to remember God's love for you? While the medieval British people loved the relics of a dead saint's hand and I love to look at photographs of a 1,700 year-old building, I'm sure that you have something that speaks to you. Take a moment right now and name that object aloud. Go and get it; touch it; and from this point on, from time to time, stop and express your gratitude to God for His mercy shown to you through this holy relic in your own life.



So, without much notice at all, eleven households responded — and boy did they! All items were sorted, boxed, and labelled. One box was completely filled with nothing





The Shrine of St. Columba, in which the bones of St. Columba's hand have been stored for nearly 1,000 years.


